Since 2004, *Te mana o te moana* has welcomed and cared for more than 630 sea turtles at the Sea Turtle Care Center in Moorea and has educated more than 130,000 children on environmental issues. On Tetiaroa atoll, the nonprofit organization's teams have observed and protected thousands of green sea turtle hatchlings and collected crucial data on the impact of climate change and predation on Tetiaroa green sea turtle nesting sites.
